When did this change take effect?

This change took effect for all homes permitted after September 1, 2021.

What was changed?

Texas House Bill 3215 updated the state's universal energy code compliance pathway to allow cities to accept the HERS Index (in addition to 2018 IECC backstops) for energy code compliance across the state, in lieu of the traditional ICC version of state energy code or any ICC stretch code adopted by municipalities.

What HERS score is needed to achieve compliance?

Each home needs to score at or below the following target HERS Index score, based on climate zone:

HERS Index Target Score

Climate Zone	9/1/22-8/31/25	9/1/25-8/31/28	On or After 9/1/28	Through 8/31/22
2	59	57	55	63
3	59	57	55	63
4	63	61	59	67

What does a HERS Rating include?

Energy Modeling

Pre-drywall inspection

Final inspection and testing, including duct and envelope leakage and ventilation testing.

- Only Certified RESNET HERS Raters can use the HERS Index referenced in TX HB 3215
- Certified RESNET HERS Raters successfully completed stringent training and certification process following industry-recognized national standards that demonstrate knowledge in the applications of building science
- Texas law requires any third-party that is providing energy code compliance verification be International Code Council (ICC) certified. HERS Raters can earn the new ICC certification, the IECC/ HERS Compliance Specialist, developed in conjunction with RESNET, combining energy code and energy efficiency expertise for plan review and inspection
